- Some teachers to have a bit more of an understanding the way they speak to parents aswell as children
- As my child is only in reception, I've not had a lot of experience with how bad behaviour is dealt with. However, I feel children learn from their parents and the worst behaviour I've seen, is from them!! Examples: Bad language Disgusting parking/blocking roads Leaving engines running Smoking (one parent didn't even wait until they were out of the gates!!) Speeding/tooting horns Shouting aggressively at their children in the yard. I have witnessed an occasion while walking home, a child shouting names at another child and the parent just turned a blind eye. I understand school doesn't have control over these matters but I wanted to bring it to your attention that it all happens on a daily basis. The council needs to get involved with the traffic before a child is seriously injured! Clearly the letters sent out are being ignored.
- The school yard is far from orderly or calm. There are families who are, and certain families whom are not. Screaming: screeching and threatening their children. Obviously we all have "bad" mornings but this is consistent with the same families and very awkward to be in the environment. My child comes home telling me the same swear words heard by the same children several times per week, I am unsure how this is handled in school but I am told often its said in lunch time and also certain children in assembly.
- I think the school works very hard to maintain good behaviour. Some instances of poor behaviour are present but this is something which I believe the school is working on.
- As my child has problems with soiling I was really worried how she would cope but a an was put Into place and every episode is dealt with quickly with minimum fuss and without bringing it to the attention of her classmates. I cannot praise them enough for the support I have received.
